Committee meetings began at 9:00 AM in the School of Dental Medicine in Alton, IL. One board member (Ed Hightower) was absent.

Paul Sarvela reported on the SHEEO cost study.

Dave Loftus (USG) spoke and asked the board to reconsider the Mass Transit fee. Talked about safety concerns for students. (This is the only fee that the undergraduate students supported.)

Chancellor Vandegrift presented the fee increases for the Edwardsville campus. All fee were supported by the SIUE students.

Tuition Rates

The increase for graduate education at SIUE was withdrawn.

Professional education (Medicine, Law) will increase in the range of 3% - 12%.

Temporary financial arrangements have been made to operate on the FY10 budget for FY11 -- until such time as the legislature takes action on the FY11 budget allocation.

Operating and capital RAMP guidelines approved.

The Farm Service Center project on the Carbondale campus was approved. This will be build the 3 buildings lost to the 2008 ice storm and the May 8, 2009 storm. The funding comes from FEMA, university self-insurance, insurance coverage proceeds.

Approved requiring new employees to use electronic deposit for paychecks

Pulled GG -- this is tied to the borrowing bill that is sitting on his governor's desk. It is expected that there will be an emergency meeting of the BOT in June. The next scheduled meeting is in July.

A resolution was read into the minutes celebrating the life or President/Chancellor Dr. John C. Guyon. Mrs. Trish Guyon and Don Wilson, a long time friend and colleague of Dr. Guyon were in attendance.

Dr. Poshard talked about legislative issues -- the he believes they will most likely pass a budget before the May 31 deadline. Believes there will be similar delays in receiving state appropriations in FY11 that we experienced in FY10.

Don't expect any significant monies from state in next six to eight weeks.

Borrowing is not a long term solution -- only one financial tool available.

Some good news -- \$3.5M was released for capital renewal.

Laura Barrett -- also spoke in support of Chartwells employees to receive fair wages.
